RECONSTRUCTED CLASSIC REGISTRATION APPLICATION

VMCC A3 form

If your vehicle has been built using genuine period components of the same specification, sourced from more than one vehicle your vehicle should be assessed under reconstructed classic to get an age related registration number.

Your vehicle must be inspected and a true reflection of the marque. (Please see DVLA information leaflet INF26. Guidelines on how you can register kit cars and rebuilt or radically altered vehicles for more information.)

Reconstructed classics or replica vehicles built to original specification using a mixture of new and used major components, will be issued a Q registration number. The vehicle must go through the Motorcycle Single Vehicle approval scheme - MSVA).

An age related registration number will be issued based on the youngest major component used.

Major Components are: the unchanged original frame, engine, gearbox (if separate), forks and wheels/hubs.

DO NOT APPLY UNTIL YOUR VEHICLE IS COMPLETE AND ROAD WORTHY:

- This application should take no longer than **4 weeks**
- Your application will be returned if we do not have the correct photos or if the form has not been completed correctly (please see page 4 for list of requested photographs).
- A build up inspection report will be valid for 12 Months from the date of issue.

The DVLA are inspecting vehicles at random even if your vehicle has been inspected by a VMCC machine examiner. SGS are a Swiss company who inspect vehicles on behalf of the DVLA and you will be informed in writing if a vehicle inspection is required, you will not be charged. SGS will check that the vehicle exists and the frame and engine numbers are recorded correctly.

Please supply as many of the details we ask for as possible, including any prefixes or suffixes to the Frame, Engine, Forks and Gearbox numbers. In the case of rarer machines, if you have any supporting information it may help us if you can supply photocopies.

Your vehicle will be inspected by a VMCC machine examiner. The inspection report and the photographs will be sent to the VMCC marque specialist for their approval. Please allow up to 4 weeks for your inspection report to be completed.

Vehicles registered as "Reconstructed classics" will be issued with a new DVLA Vin number.

What photographs you need to send:

1. Clear photos of the whole motorcycle from both sides
2. Rubbings or photographs of any numbers on the major components
3. A close up photo of the engine from both sides
4. Close up photo of the forks from the front and the sides
5. Close up photos of the hubs and wheels

We cannot supply a built-up report if you do not supply the requested photographs. Photos must be clear. You can print the photographs or email them to library@vmcc.net.
